

JEREMY KYLE

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Here is a television presenter with his own show called the Jeremy Kyle Show who thinks too much of himself and is irritating beyond the point of no return. Since shallow people like controversy and arguments on television, which are sometimes very fierce and occasionally violent, they will watch this show which, at least, one High Court Judge, called trash.

As said before, what is society coming to when we have such shows which attract large audiences. Society's obsession with negativity and the awful problems of others is another indication of how sick society has become. What people admire in the objectionable Simon Cowell they admire in the interfering and intrusive Jeremy Kyle.

He was born in Reading on 7 July 1965. His father was an accountant and a personal secretary to the Queen Mother.

Kyle studied history and sociology at the University of Surrey. His first marriage to Kristy Rowley did not last long. He had a very serious gambling addiction with its resultant financial problems. The couple had a daughter, Harriet.

Then he met a former model Carla Germaine in 1999 and they married in 2002. They have two daughters and a son.

While Kyle is quick to condemn the guests on his show, including these with addictions and disorders, he has an OCD, an obsessive compulsive disorder in that he regularly licks his mobile phone to make sure it is clean. Towards the end of 2012, he was diagnosed with testicular cancer but has, apparently, been given the all clear.

But to backtrack. For nine years from 1986, he sold life insurance and was a radio advertising consultant. He had brief appointments with radio stations in Taunton, Leicester, Kent and Birmingham around 1997 where he presented shows like Late and Live and Jezza's Jukebox.

In July 2005, ITV aired his first Jeremy Kyle Show in which he interviews guests and others involved in disputes. He conducts Lie Detector Tests and DNA tests to find out, for example, who is the father of some women's baby. Almost all his guests are of poor quality, perhaps unemployed and unemployable, with tattoos and body piercings; there are drug addicts, or drug takers, who have no purpose or goal in life. On the show we have fat women who shout and scream at each other and clearly lack both good sense and courtesy and they also lack reason and there are male guests some men who sleep around and have no morals at all. Sometimes peoples storm off the stage or there are fights and things are thrown. Some guests have few or no teeth and do not even dress tidily. My researchers have said that there are never respectable, nice people on the show, only riff-raff.

We might be accused of being judgemental but Kyle certainly is judgemental and often unfairly so. He takes sides and is therefore biased. Who is he to sit in judgement?

He often says that some couples on the show should not have had children. He may be right and he talks about safe sex. Again, that is a fair comment but he says to the man, "Put something on the end of it!" and that is crude. Why doesn't he say, "Use contraception!"

When he feels a male guest is not taking responsibility he says, "Grow a pair!" which we take to mean have balls which is another crude saying. "Be a man," is sufficient.

He constantly refers to his programme as "My show" or "This is the Jeremy Kyle Show". This self-importance is irritating and unnecessary.

Often he says to a guest, "Get off my stage!" He calls some people scum and a waste of space and refers to some as the worst people he has ever met.

He then rants, "I can help you!" Who does he think he is? He is not a doctor, psychiatrist or psychologist. He has a member of his team who is a gentle, likeable counsellor.

Another gross irritation is when he says to someone, "Look at me. Look at me!" This narcissism is offensive. If I were on his show and just found out my wife has been cheating on me the last thing I would want to do to is to look at Jeremy Kyle.

On a very recent show there was a young woman in great distress and Kyle kept shouting at her, "Look at me. Look at me. Look at me!"

How insensitive and rude.

I have also heard him say to a man, "If you don't do... I will make sure that you will never see your wife and children again!" He has said this many times.

What right has he to say this?

No wonder he is known as a bully and a thug.

He does complain about people living on benefits and that the State and those of us who pay our taxes are supporting their laziness. He is right in saying this and there are hard working people whose income is less than some people who are on benefits. I understand that drug addicts and those with alcohol dependency are classed as disabled and get extra benefits. One unemployed man on this annoying show, whose name was Malcolm, spends £100 a day on drugs and when asked where does he get the money from, he replied, "From my benefits!"

This show has been called a type of Eastenders or Coronation Street, full of who is sleeping with who, who is on drugs, who is so and so having an affair with and trivial and kitchen sink drama. I cannot understand why people want to be entertained by this sort of thing. Why does he, his staff and audiences want to deal with morbid and dysfunctional people? It is true that he deliberately goads some guests into temper and violence. His shows are repetitive, full of crying, shouting, lack of logic and lies and he says, "Look at me. I can help you!"

Why would anyone want to go on this show? Why would anyone want to watch it?

Jeremy Kyle is boastful and rude just like Simon Cowell. And they both put people down!

When it was announced that he was going to America to do his show there was rejoicing. People thought he would cease his UK show. How disappointing was that since his UK show continues!

He does help children particularly those with disabilities and has a reputation of being a good family man. Of course we totally commend this but he is still objectionable, rude and insulting to people and has this elevated opinion of himself. His self-promotion and arrogance should find no friends either and he has no right to victimise anyone.

In September 2015, it was announced that Kyle and his wife had separated due to their 'having moved apart'. Others, including those who know the couple, said that Kyle had become even more insufferable. He had also been branded a pervert in dealing with a blond young guest called Lucy whom he touched several times and was over friendly with her and in a most unprofessional way. I saw this interview and did think that his behaviour was inappropriate.

A man came on the stage accused of not being a father to his child who was now an adult. Six times Kyle asked, Have you been a good father? And each time the guest tried to answer and was immediately shouted down by the same question. The guest was not given the chance to respond.

Kyle makes much of the Lie Detector results and their alleged accuracy. Up to 10%, or more, are likely to be wrong. Yet he refers to them as his tests and the staff on the programme as his team. He talks about the platform for the guests as his stage and the complete studio as his building.

He constantly reminds us that he is an old man at 50 years of age !

Kyle is so arrogant and egotistic. He keeps saying, This is the Jeremy Kyle Show and I will deal with all matters my way because it is my show. He does not have to say his name in any way in any show. It is all self-promotion and narcissism. He is out to constantly remind us of his superiority and that he is better than others. He is selfish and an egomaniac. That he is prejudiced is obvious ; he is rude in that he shows great dislike for people and is clearly unfair. He is severely harsh and judgmental. There is no doubt that he is insidious, harmful and wanting to entrap someone. He enjoys causing people to be hurt, angry and upset. He is rude and extremely unpleasant. He specialises in slander and acts as judge and jury and passes sentence. Who does he think he is ?

But many programmes on ITV deal with rudeness and negative matters such as I'm a celebrity, get me out of here. Then there is that weird Keith Lemon, The Only Way is Essex and The X Factor which is supposed to be a singing contest and where Simon Cowell praises singers who are out of tune, shout, bawl and screech.

As for Jeremy Kyle all this information is in the public domain already and I am saying nothing new. I wonder how much he gets paid for being so insolent?

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
