

## **PSYCHICS ARE PSYCHOTIC**

Let us begin with definitions.

A psychic is a person who claims to have powers or beliefs that cannot be explained or proved and which powers and beliefs defy credibility.

A psychotic is someone who suffers from psychosis which is a severe mental disorder in which the sufferer has lost contact with reality and believes in things that are not real. It may involve a personality change since it is an abnormal condition of the mind, and included in the delusions may be paranoia.

To be deluded is to suffer from delusions which are mistaken ideas or beliefs, and, when the sufferer finds out that these ideas are wrong they are said to be disillusioned.

In writing about the beliefs of spiritualists, mediums and psychics one is left with the fact that they are clearly delusional. They believe in things which are neither true nor real, things that cannot be proved and, in fact, where there is evidence which proves them wrong. How can anyone believe in Atlantis as a real place when it is proved that it was a fictional island in the writings of Plato? How can anyone believe in Betty Shine when evidence has been produced to show that she was a fraud and a charlatan? How can anyone believe that aliens in their spaceships make crop circles when all the evidence show that they are man made? Who can believe David Icke when he says that Ted Heath murdered children and when he tells people that a parent is speaking from the grave when that parent is not even dead but very much alive? Shine and Icke were, and are frauds, and there is no doubt about that.

The whole tenure of these modern teachings from Atlantis to Icke, from aliens to Shine, from surgical healings from a distance to cot deaths being essential because the spirits in another dimension want those young lives, is delusional. Belief in these things is, at the least, misplaced and those who invent and promote such teachings are delusional and cause offence, illness and suicide, and those who believe such things are also deluded and in dangerous error.

A recent event has shown me further evidence of this dangerous nonsense.

Don is 64 and was a healthy man. But, suddenly, he became ill with what was called high anxiety and severe depression. He would not put on any electrical appliance for fear it would blow the house up ; he would not allow his wife to be out of his sight ; he said that he had cancer and even lifted the carpet in the bedroom to view how the cancer was spreading ; the dog got into the bedroom and contracted cancer and was now dead on the living room floor yet it was still barking. Every time Don burped he said, " There we are... my stomach cancer speaks again." He kept dropping his trousers to look at his bottom where his cancer was. He said to his wife that all the boxes in the living room must be handed over to the police and yet there were no boxes in the room. He was prescribed some pills but would not take them as they were contaminated with poison. He was going to die. He said that spirits from another world were going to kill him because he did not believe in spiritualism and the proclamations of psychics.

He was very ill and sectioned under the Mental Health Act and taken into a psychiatric ward.

This nice man believed all this nonsense such as the dangers of the microwave, that he had cancer and that psychics were out to kill him. He was now psychotic which is the term for someone with this type of mental illness.

What happens to these patients is that an idea comes into the mind and stays there and, even though it is untrue, it becomes real and this idea spreads like a cancer until that one idea becomes many ideas such as the danger of the microwave, the cancer which is also under the carpet and all over the bedroom, the dog is dead and it is his fault, that he cannot be left alone and the pills from the doctor are poison. All of this is tragic and to add to this, the spirits in another dimension must be obeyed.

To see Don like this and to hear him speak this nonsense was frightening and so very sad and this sadness cannot be expressed in words. He was psychotic suffering from delusions. He was very ill believing in things that were unreal and having lost the sense of reality.

His wife said, " What has happened to my husband?"

How does one answer that?

It may be true to say that people who believe in all this psychic nonsense are not mentally ill but those who promote this stuff and write books, make videos and give displays and teach these dangerous concepts are psychotic. What is the difference in principle between the belief that there is cancer under the mat and that Betty Shine can perform difficult surgical operations without being with the patient and, in fact, being thousands of miles away and that the greatest surgeons in the world did not know how to operate? What is the difference in principle that the dog is dead but is still barking and running around, and that David Icke was present on Atlantis, the fictional island? What is the difference in principle between not switching on the microwave for fear of an explosion to the teaching that cot deaths are essential because the spirits in another dimension to possess them?

Consider this. Here is a lovely young couple who have tried for some time to have a baby and eventually one is born and they are delighted. Later he dies a cot death and David Icke says it was necessary for the spirit of that child was wanted by spirits in another dimension!

How cruel and offensive is that. One can understand why such parents would want to take a shotgun to him!

As we have said many times spiritualists, mediums, psychics and the like call themselves spiritual which word has several meanings. The word spiritual is originally a Biblical word in both the Old and New Testaments and refers to the conditional of believing in the God of the Bible, the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, the God who spoke to the prophets ; and the word spiritual is used in the New Testament to describe those who have faith in Jesus Christ, the Son of God and the Saviour of all those who put their trust in Him.
