

ROGUES, RACISM AND REBELLION

There are those who are very interested in rogues and crooks and have acquired books and videos about them. That, itself, may be a genuine interest but to admire them and prefer them to decent and moral people, who it is said are boring, is very worrying.

Such people have strange heroes and, for example, one such hero is John Michael Osbourne known as Ozzy.

He was born in Birmingham on 3 December 1948 and is known for hard rock music, heavy metal music and doom rock. He is dyslexic, has an attention-seeking disorder and other learning difficulties. He became a fan of The Beatles and formed the group Black Sabbath which group has rightly been called noisemakers rather than music. In fact, heavy metal has a thick massive sound with amplified distortion and overall loudness. It has led to deafness in some.

A prank led to the death of his guitarist Randy Rhoades.

Osbourne said he was C of E and prayed before every concert. But he was influenced by Satanism although it would probably be wrong to call him a Satanist. One of his albums is entitled Speak of the Devil.

He became a drug addict and developed alcohol abuse. He was foul-mouthed and objectionable. He first took cocaine in 1971 and has over forty years of drug abuse.

He is regarded as being a very bad influence on teenagers. In 1984, a Californian teenager, John McCullum, committed suicide listening to Osbourne's Solution Suicide and it has been reported regularly that Osbourne promoted suicide.

In 1982, he bit off the head of a bat and previously had bitten off the head of a dove although some say it was a one off event. This is irrational behaviour and therefore indicates a mental problem and a severe one.

With his albums, he was very successful and made a lot of money and one wonders why people liked him, but everyone to their own taste. He and his music was invariably black and negative and of no helpful influence to anybody.

The name Black Sabbath is offensive to the Jewish community and the Satanic connection is again shown in his album, Prince of Darkness, a reference to Satan, and there is another album entitled Ultimate Sin.

He married first Thelma Riley and, in 1982, Sharon Arden. He has five children and has adopted another.

It is diagnosed that Osbourne has bipolar disorder which is a manic-depressive mental illness with shifts in mood, energy and activity. All the information about mental health included here is from reliable medical sources and not opinions.

Mental, of course, refers to the brain and the health of the brain depends on the state of the mind and the level of truth. A distorted mind produces negative emotions and irrational behaviour and can lead to serious problems and even suicide. Lack of knowledge and the non-acceptance of the truth produces mental problems and can have very serious consequences.

Alcoholism is medically defined as a mental illness. It is an addiction, a compulsive and uncontrollable consumption of alcohol. Dependence of drugs not prescribed by a doctors and consultants is an addiction and, a mental illness, as is depression, anorexia and schizophrenia which is often characterised by hallucinations and the belief in things that are not true and also the failure to accept the truth and reality. Obsessive Compulsion Disorder (OCD) is a mental disorder.

I knew someone who had OCD and would get up in the night and go through the house with disinfectant and polish. But she overcame this problem.

ADHD is also categorized as a mental disorder.

Many of these mental illnesses are self-induced such as the additions to alcohol and drugs.

Sadly, depiction of mental disorders on television programmes may differ from reality.

One does not like to describe anyone as mental, but it is clear that Ozzy Osbourne has serious mental problems and this may well influence and affect not only him but those who admire both him and his music.

There are those who defend him and complain that people who object to him, his music and life style do not live in the real world and are retarded... yes, that is the verdict of some of his fans and they also condemn those who think differently than them because it judges them.

Their own mental health is, therefore, a concern.

Some have been active supporters of the Palestinians and, therefore, are probably judgmental about the Jews and some possess a Palestinian flag.

To some extent, such pro-Arab supporters have been influenced by two politicians who, incidentally, are both atheists and who hate the Jews. One is Ken Livingstone, who was the mayor of London, and the other is George Galloway who has said that he wants his city of Bradford to be a Jew-free zone. His historical facts about Palestine are completely wrong. He does not accept the proven facts that the Palestinians caused the troubles which started with the 'first' Arab, Ishmael who hated his brother, Isaac, who was a Hebrew and Hebrews were later known as Jews.

It was the Jews that cultivated Palestine in the middle of the 19th century and therefore had the right to it.

In the 1930s, Palestinians attacked Gilead and murdered and raped many. There were other incidents. The Jews willingly gave the Palestinians three areas of their country. They did not have to. Legally, in 1948, the land was rightfully and legally stated to be the land of Israel, not the land of the Palestinians. The Arabs started many wars against Israel and lost them all. In recent times, the Israelis are guilty of some events but when you think of what they have suffered (six million died at Hitler's behest and others as a result of Arab aggression) one can understand it to some extent. The Jews are the most persecuted people on earth and have been so for thousands of years.

I have a close Jewish friend and he is constantly accused of being a dirty bastard of a Jew. He is a very kind and gentle man and has had to call out the police several times. He has been accused of certain things which his heath and age would not allow. Such false accusations are utterly despicable, abusive, offensive and defamation of character and the law should be tightened up and all offenders be taken to Court and put on an offenders register.

That Livingstone and Galloway are racist cannot be denied. They are also bigots and they have influenced people to share their hatred of the Jews. They are discriminatory and their hatred is totally unfair and unacceptable.

Racism is the belief that one's own race is superior and, therefore, that other races and peoples are inferior and they believe that they have the right to dominate others. Racism is the hatred and intolerance of others sometimes with the display of abusive and aggressive behaviour.

Bigotry is the stubborn intolerance of beliefs other than their own which shows prejudice and action. However, it does not apply to people who have the same basic belief but which may differ from others with the same basic belief such as denominationism in the church. Catholics and Protestants are both Christian in principle but have varying interpretations. Of course, some have become militant and that is inexcusable. If Moslems state that Christians are infidels then that is both racism and bigotry.

But there is more to Galloway and Livingstone. Galloway, born 1954, was sacked from the Labour Party on four serious charges of bringing the party into disrepute. He claimed to be an opponent of Saddam Hussein but when he visited Iraq in 1994 he said of Hussein, Sir, I salute your courage, your strength and your indefatigability. When Galloway condemned the London bombings of July 2005, he said that the hatred and bitterness felt among Moslems was because of the invasion of Iraq. His remarks were universally said to be disgraceful and his dipping his usual poisonous tongue into a pool of blood. In 2006, he said that a suicide attack on Tony Blair would be justified.

At a public meeting he walked out because a Jew was present.

Galloway became the leader of the Respect party but respect is something he does not have as shown in this essay.

Livingstone was born in 1945 and belonged to the hard left of the Labour Party until he was also sacked from the party. He was known as Red Ken. He supported controversial issues like republicanism, LGBT rights, that is to say the rights of lesbians, gays, bisexuals and transgenders advocating same sex marriage and parenting for gays and many other matters.. He also advocated an united Ireland. He turned down an invitation to Prince Charles' wedding to Diana. He allowed Irish protesters to hold a vigil on the steps of County Hall and said that the view that the IRA being criminals or lunatics was a misunderstanding. He was accused of cronyism, that is to say favouritism shown to friends without regard to their qualifications and giving them jobs in politics and there was his racist his antisemtiism as we have seen. He has been accused of using public money for his own personal and political reasons. He was the Leader of the GLC from 1981-3 and, later, the mayor of London.

Those who are pro-Arab are entitled to their beliefs but if they believe that the Jews are an inferior race does that make them racist? Is it wise to go demonstrations denoting their support of the Arabs and disapproval of the Jews? But many admire Livingstone and Galloway!

There are those who enjoy being rebels!

A rebel is one who is opposed to the political system of one's country and wants to change it even if that means using force, blackmail and crime as was the case with the miners strike. To oppose political dogma is one thing, but to use violence and crime and blackmail is wrong. A rebel is one who refuses allegiance to any authority or tradition. Again one can see cases where this may be acceptable, but to oppose the traditional values of politeness and decency is totally unacceptable. Rebels want to overthrow good standards and are generally adverse to moral standards. They want to do what is right as they see it, and if that means breaking the law and being what is accepted as immoral they will do it. Extreme rebels are anarchists.

Another rogue is Mick Jagger of the Rolling Stones which is a rock band formed in London in 1962.

The band consisted of Jagger, Brian Jones, Ian Stewart, Bill Wyman and Charlie Watts.

The Rolling Stones belonged to the rebellious counterculture and the group were well-known for their long hair. Jagger was born on 26 July 1943 and the leader of the group.

Many of their songs were Satanic but I am not saying that they were Satanists. The two obvious titles were Their Satanic Majesties Request of 1967 and Sympathy for the Devil. How can anyone have sympathy for the Devil who is the prince of darkness, the father of lies and the enemy of all decency and morality.

There are ten songs about drugs such as Mother's Little Helper, Brown Sugar, Monkey Man and, less obviously, is the song Sticky Fingers. Some evidence of this is on the internet.

Although it will be denied, there are sexually perverse songs such as Let it bleed and I can't get no satisfaction which refers to menstruation as one of the group finally admitted. Sticky Fingers referred to sex by hand and Let's spend the night together which is obvious in its meaning.

The group were into drugs. There was the possession of cannabis in 1967 and Jones went to prison. Jagger was arrested for possession of amphetamines. Richards was addicted to heroin and fined. Jagger and the rest of the group with charged with making use of narcotics at drug parties in a luxury villa on the French Riviera.

I have heard it said that this group wrote and performed real music and that some women would have loved to have had sex with Jagger. This was the 1960s which some assert was the greatest decade of all time with the mini skirt, free sex and no rules. People will not accept the truth that the introduction of the mini skirt was revealing and led to an epidemic of unwanted teenage pregnancies. In this context, the mini skirt was certainly ill advised and had disastrous consequences and was part of the decadent 1960s.

The unwanted teenage pregnancies followed the introduction of the mini skirt resulted in 38% of all resultant pregnancies in the UK.

One of my pupils loved the Beatles and acquired front row tickets for one of their concerts and, for this occasion brought a mini skirt to wear and sat with her legs open wearing no underwear so that the group would see and desire her. And yet she was brought up in a good home.

Jagger, who has seven children was granted a knighthood. The Queen refused to conduct this ceremony herself as he was unsuitable. She was right. He rudely called her the Chief Witch.

Perhaps we should define what a rogue is. He is a dishonest and worthless person having contempt for honesty, decency and morality. He is a baddie, a beast or a devil and could even be a monster.

Such a monster was Charles Manson, an American criminal, born in 1932, who was guilty of conspiracy to murder seven people. He was influenced by the Beatles and their song Helter Skelter, an expression he used to describe an impending apocalyptic race war in which the blacks would be blamed. The murders were committed by his followers known as his 'family' and the victims included the pregnant Sharon Tate, the wife of the film director Roman Polanski. The choice of this victim was made to reach national headlines.

Manson spent much of his life before this in jail for various offences including burglary and robberies.

At his trial, he was described as a Satanist which was never denied. He was evil.

Other people had a fascination for the Kray twins who were born in London in 1933.

Ronnie died in 1995 and Reggie in 2000.

They were London gangsters from the East End. It is clear that Ronnie suffered from paranoid schizophrenia and he was gay and it was alleged that he had a homosexual affair with Lord Boothby and, later, with the Labour MP, Tom Driberg. Eventually, Ronnie was certified as insane.

At the height of their powers, they were involved in armed robberies, arson, protection rackets, assaults and the murders of Jack 'The Hat' McVite and George Cornell.

Some of their activities are said to be noble and worthy such as their boxing clubs for boys but there is some evidence that this was because Ronnie was gay and was sexually aroused by beautiful boys.

The Krays were associated with celebrities and politicians and greatly feared being notorious for their gang activities and violence. They were both sentenced to life imprisonment in 1969.

Towards the end of his life, Reggie said that he had become a 'born again' Christian.

Apart from Manson, all the subjects so far have had London connections. There are many who say that London was the place to be. It is a vibrant, lively city and not boring like rural places. It is said that you have only really lived if you have lived in London.

It is said that good girls go to heaven and bad girls go to London.

It is one thing to have an interest in such people but to admire them, even slightly, is a cause for concern.

It would probably be wrong to say that Tony Benn was a rogue but he regarded Arthur Scargill as a long standing friend and he supported the evil Miners' Strike of 1984-5 which cost three lives and many injuries and cost the country over six million pounds.

The strike was not primarily intended to protect the miners and their jobs, but it was Scargill and Benn's desire to bring down both the Conservative government and Margaret Thatcher. The way to change the government is by Parliamentary procedure and elections not by the deception of an industrial strike. Both these men were so anti-Thatcher that it was obsessive, vitriolic and certainly not democratic. If you want a new government and a new Prime Minister there is a proper and accepted procedure to follow.

Both Benn and Scargill were left wingers. Left wingers state that they support social equality and egalitarianism, which means equality for all. But the Labour Party which consists of many left wingers are financially supported by the Trade Unions who object to capitalism, that is to say money and those who have it, and the unions are often selfish wanting their own way and not putting the country first as shown in this illegal miners strike.

In this disgraceful event, the 'British left' were in gross error holding the country to ransom but Thatcher defeated the British left.

When Benn was postmaster general from 1964, he wanted the head of the Queen removed from stamps. He was dismissive of a woman whose family was executed by Saddam Hussein. Benn was against the liberation of Libya from the despot Gaddafi and yet was very keen to stop war, which was a very commendable policy.

The miners' strike was illegal because there was no ballot of the members and therefore it was not only illegal but also unconstitutional.

Thatcher was blamed for the closure of 20 mines and 70 pits yet it was the National Coal Board that wanted these closures because they were not producing enough coal and money was being wasted in wages. But it was not the miners fault that the coal production was drying up.

One of the major events of the strike was the battle of Ogreave where 5000 miners fought 5000 police.

Benn and Scargill wanted to free the strikers in prison for their killing of a taxi driver and the two miners who he was attempting to take to work. Why should these murderers be set free?

The miners were not paid during the strike and yet Scargill was.

How could an intelligent and peace-loving man like Benn support Scargill and not denounce despots like Hussein and Gaddafi?

Because many believe in and like these people, or has some admiration for them, may be what leads them to hate all Christians. Of course, there are good and bad people in every walk of life and there are Christians who are frauds and hypocrites. People who are anti-Jews are often atheists and it is interesting to note that many left wingers, and also other members of the Labour party, past and present, are atheists. That is, of course, their choice, but we have found that many such people turn to other beliefs such as Satanism as indicated here, and may turn to other aspects of the occult which aspects are also immoral and indecent and is often sexually perverse.

It would be totally wrong to call Jade Goody a rogue but as racism has appeared in this essay it may seem appropriate to make a reference to her.

She was a reality-television-personality, born in 1981. On a Celebrity Big Brother show, she was accused of racial bullying and evicted from the show. To her credit, she admitted that she was racist and apologised many times. In common parlance she was said to be gobby.

She died of cervical cancer and the medical services were criticised for their alleged negligence.

In 2009, she and her two sons were christened and that was the year she died. Her life and death has done much to make women aware of this illness.

It hardly bears thinking about what she suffered.

London in the 1960s was known as swinging London and this decade was known as the Swinging Sixties. This was a catch-phrase applied to the fashion and cultural scene in London in the 1960s.

It was hedonistic and psychedelic. Psychedelic means a mental state characterised by a profound sense of intense memory perception sometimes accompanied by severe perceptual distortion and hallucinations with feelings of euphoria or despair. The taking of drugs often produced this mental state.

The psychedelic state was of no benefit to anyone but often dangerous.

It has been said, and with some truth, that the decline of British society really began with the decadence of the 1960s.

I have often wondered why so many girls and women prefer bad boys and rogues. These women claim that such men are attractive and more masculine looking and as they are rough they will be better at sex. They are exciting and adventurous as they are risk takers not conforming to decency and convention. Women who have been brought up well turn against such upbringing and rebel against this and their parents' wishes that makes them an independent and modern woman which decent people do not understand. Nice men put their women first and maintain the standards of decency, love and genuine care. To some extent, the rise of feminism disregards this since women should not be bogged down by a decent man and convention.
