

TERROR IN NORWAY AND POLITICS

Norway is a country of 4.9 million people. It has a Labour government.

32 year-old Anders Behring Breivik set off a bomb in Oslo which building housed the office of the Prime Minister. This was on Friday 23 July 2011 and seven were killed and many wounded.

Dressed as a police officer, he then went to the island of Utoya, about a hour away, where there was a Labour Party's Youth Camp and shot dead some 69 people. He used special bullets designed to disintegrate inside each victim's body causing severe damage to the internal organs.

Breivik did not shoot himself as most mass murderers do. He gave himself up as he wanted his day in Court to explain his actions. He admitted that his actions were atrocious but necessary.

He is clearly anti-Muslim and fears that Muslims will take over Europe. He objects to Norway becoming multi-cultural.

He has been influenced by the writings of John Stuart Mill who wrote that one person with a belief is equal to the force of 100,00 who have only interests. Mill was British living from 1806 -1873. He wrote books about liberty and said that each individual has the right to act as he wills as long as it causes no harm. He also wrote about the tyranny of the majority and Breivik may believe that the Muslims will become the majority in Europe and be tyrannical.

He is also anti-Marxism. The Marxist doctrine is the product of Karl Marx and Friedrich Engels. Marxism, which is another name for both Communism and Socialism opposes capitalism advocating socialism dogma that everything that makes a profit must belong to the State. Marx refers to the class struggle and the right of the proletariat, the working class or lower class, as he called it. He also said that socialism must take over since what is needed is a universal Communism revolution.

Marx, Engels, Lennin and Stalin were both Communists and atheists. The last two mentioned purged Russia and the Ukraine of Christians and destroyed churches. They were evil regimes and so their Communism was evil.

A former Labour leader, Michael Foot said you cannot possibly be a socialist and a Christian. The term Christian Socialist is a contradiction in terms.

I hear some people say that there is Christian Communism. How can this be when Communism has a long history of murdering Christians?

But to return to Breivik. His lawyer, Geir Lippestad has said that his client is probably insane.

This raises the question of when does mental illness become insanity?

This mass murderer had produced a manifesto of 1500 pages setting out his views and apparently saying that he had been planning this massacre since 2009.

Someone has described him as a Christian fundamentalist and people are quick to damn Christians but Breivik is certainly not a Christian, since Christians obey the commandment Thou shalt not kill and so this slur on Christianity is unfair and damaging.

Now I am a fundamental Christian. I believe the Bible of 66 books is the inspired Word of God and

complete for all matters of faith and doctrine. But, though I am an evangelical fundamentalist, I am not bellicose or militant. I would not kill anyone.

I do think that some Muslims may want to be the prominent influence in the world, but the majority of them are kind and decent people living their own lives quietly and respectably.

Communism and Socialism is anti-Christian.

Harold Wilson legalised homosexuality in 1967 and Tony Blair reduced the age of consent from 18 to 16 and his Labour government introduced same sex 'marriages'. Wilson introduced the legality of abortion which is now being used as the ultimate contraception and this is because two people could not take precautions in their love making which results in an innocent life being killed. Members of the Labour Party wanted to legalise some drugs which are dangerous and people like Judi Dench and Richard Branson supported this. Blair told us all to take out a private pension since, in years to come, the State Pension would not be adequate. And so we did. Then Gordon Brown taxed these pensions so that they have lost their value considerably.
