

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW ABOUT LABOUR POLITICS

Ramsay Macdonald entered Parliament in 1911 and was the first Labour Prime Minister in 1924. He was a left winger and admitted to be a friend of Lenin who was a communist, of course. Communism has its deep roots firmly in Marxism which is atheistic and, by that, is meant a harsh criticism of religion and objection to the God of the Bible and the Bible itself. As the Jews are often designated the main people of the Old Testament, or God's chosen people, the Labour party, entrenched in Marxism and Communism, is often anti-Jew. That is racism and bigotry.

When MacDonald came to power it caused great anxiety as he was a 'red' and at odds with traditional moral values. He was opposed to World War 1, and yet it was obvious that this war was inevitable. Latterly, the Labour Party called him both a traitor and a turncoat and he did have serious mental problems over many years.

Arthur Henderson, the next leader, was opposed to World War II but this war was also inevitable. Hitler had to be stopped. If we had followed Henderson what a serious situation we could have been in!

Clement Attlee was an atheist and did not uphold the moral values of the Bible but dismissed them as irrelevant, a typical Marxist reaction.

The Labour leader who had the most respect was probably Hugh Gaitskill but he introduced prescription charges which were ill advised.

Harold Wilson was a staunch left winger with his admiration of Soviet Russia and the evil KGB. He was much hated by neutrals!

James Callaghan became anti-God and an atheist but, wisely, wanted to curb the power of the trade unions and, on this issue, lost the General Election and Margaret Thatcher came to power and she won over the miners' strike which cost the UK £6 million. What a waste! Incidentally, it was not Thatcher who closed the mines but the National Coal Board!

Incidentally, Callaghan was baptised by immersion in a Baptist Chapel in Portsmouth confessing himself to be a Christian and this was before he became prominent in politics.

The successors in the Labour leadership were Michael Foot and Neil Kinnoch both atheists and viciously so. Michael Foot said you cannot be a Socialist and a Christian! These two also expressed a hatred for the Jews as did George Galloway and Ken Livingstone.

Galloway is pro Arab and a racist and was sacked from the Labour party. He stupidly said that Palestine, so-called, belongs to Palestinian Arabs. It belonged to the Jews who cultivated it in the 1850s and graciously gave three areas to the Palestinians. In any event, the land of Israel is legally the property of the Jews.

The Gospel in the New Testament advocates peace whereas the Koran has 103 references to the beheading of infidels, that is to say non-Muslims.

John Smith was a highly respected Labour leader but died young and was succeeded by Tony Blair who led us into three wars, which were not our business, and he increased the UK debt to about 1.7 trillion pounds. More of this later.

Ed Milliband was an atheist.

Many Labour politicians and supporters came from trade unions and it must be remembered that the Trade Union Movement gives the Labour Party millions of pounds each year. For example in 2010, it was 13 million.

The present leader of the Labour Party, Jeremy Corbyn, is pro-Arab and anti-Jew. He has said that we must not take action against Arabs because they are his friends. That must not be taken as his approval of terrorism. Corbyn wants to spend lots of money on several projects and bill the taxpayers who can afford it!

One matter which is strongly held by Labour is the industrialization of essential services where the costs are born by the Government. The opposite view is privatisation where an organization buys out such a service which will save both the Government and tax payers money. If we were now to privatise British Rail we would have to clear its debt of 33 billion pounds.

It is estimated that Government wastes 120 million a year. Under Tony Blair, John Prescott and Patricia Hewitt, the health secretary, they wasted a huge amount of money. Hewitt was the minister to ban smoking in public places. Blair's war in Iraq cost the UK over 8.4 billion and our involvement with Afghanistan had cost 37 billion by 2013.

Why are left wingers so anti-Jew? Have the Jews not suffered enough through Hitler and his Nazi socialism? Is it because the Jews are often said to be God's chosen people? Is it because the moral and traditional standards in the Bible condemn left wing beliefs?

So we have Labour leaders, past and present, who were and are atheists (that is 71%) and, at least, and many who were blatantly racist and anti-Jews (that is over 35%) and it must be remembered that the origins of the Labour party and their purpose are left wing politics firmly based on Communism and Marxism and these doctrines are blatantly anti-Christian, racist and these fundamental doctrines lack decent morals although some members of the Labour party are moderates.

Of course, the Conservatives have made many mistakes and, for example, are now wasting money on a new high-speed rail ink.

Some Labour politicians and supporters ridicule Christianity because of what they call Christian's alleged tribalism but the Labour party are a tribe being a group of self-acclaimed superior people.

People are entitled to their personal views but many in politics influence ordinary people to their ways of thinking such as the deplorable hatred of Christians and Jews. This is both racism and extremism. And we are fast becoming a secular society.

Whatever my religious beliefs, I cannot support the Labour Party on the grounds of their politics as evidenced here. I cannot be racist or extremist and the country cannot be held to ransom by action such as the infamous Miners' Strike.
